CSA



New Farms for New Americans (NFNA) is a social enterprise collective of immigrant and refugee farmers from Asia and Africa, coordinated by the Association of Africans Living in Vermont. NFNA growers sell produce to restaurants and grocers, at farmer's markets, and through our CSA. Farmers grow food by hand, with vast agricultural knowledge and experience, without pesticides and with a concern for sustainable practices. CSA or Community Supported Agriculture is a model of local agricultural sales. A CSA consists of a community of individuals who pledge support to a farmer by paying for a share of the farm at the beginning of the year. The consumers then share the risks and benefits of food production with the farmer. CSAs usually consist of a system of weekly delivery or pick-up of vegetables.

What we offer: Our CSA season is 16 weeks from July through October. The price is \$400 for a family share, which will feed up to four people. Shares include a bounty of seasonal vegetables and herbs, geared towards basic salad making and other commonly eaten vegetable dishes in the U.S. At times NFNA farmers will include prepared food items from their home cultures. NFNA will offer special events with CSA members, where they will have a chance to learn more about our farm and farmers. We look forward to a relationship with you!
